The Pastor's Page

Who would ever want to take a class entitled “At the Edge of Empire: Christians of the Middle East”? As I perused the list of Monday night on-campus offerings at Hartford Seminary this seemed my only choice. I met the requirements for church history several years ago. My first seminary Professor was Cuban and we attended classes in an office building in a downtown Miami, Florida office building. We met in the balmy, tropical early afternoons. He was sure to bring a frothing pitcher of high powered, sugary café Cubano to keep us awake as we studied church history.

Studying church history the past three months from 6:30 to 9:30 PM has moved my last cup of coffee later in the afternoon as I remembered my early church history studies. But thankfully, this course has been anything but a drawn out review of church history peppered with all its scandals, persecutions and constant reformations.

I won't go into this deep and often dark subject of church history and send you running for a cup of coffee as you read this article. What I will pass on, is an essay question on my mid-term. It asked about Orthodoxy, do we think there is a place for orthodoxy in the modern church, in light of our post-modern and post-Christian world. I won't tackle all that I wrote in this article that might send you looking for some dark roast Java. What I will say is that “the Congregational Way” meets orthodoxy head on.

What do I mean by this? Our Congregational ancestors ran up against what we call in theology “Empiricism” the tendency of the church to embrace empire, nation, state and forms of government. The result is usually orthodoxy, structure, control of theology, and hierarchical church structures of clergy and often government. The churches that existed outside of the empires throughout history have survived and managed better relations with diverse peoples with a more fluid theology than the rigid and orthodox western versions.

One of the things most often controlled in Western churches is its theology. Theology is often viewed as only what clergy study, and only what the minister understands. But, simply put, theology is the study of God. We ask about the nature of God. The congregational way says that we are all capable of “doing theology” and to this I applaud. My theology degree gives me no “leg up” or special channel to understanding God any more than anyone else.

This is why you will see no theological “tomes” to make sure theology is the same in every church and its members (orthodoxy). We should not have a theological statement from the pulpit each week that comes with absolutes. I believe in the congregational way that empowers you. I prefer a message that gives you choices, and allows you to wrestle with your own theology. We have no set of beliefs or scriptural pledges we ask you to sign. We don't tell you to take this or leave it. I offer no adherence to literalistic views of the Bible and it's polar opposite. We are all capable of doing theology and most importantly living theology, even when we might disagree. This is called orthopraxy.

As we prepare for the wondrous weeks of the conclusion of lent and the move into the Easter celebration of the work of the Christ. I pray that you find the freedom and liberty to discover what the Congregational Way means to your life as we practice this learning experience we call life together. We live as a community with different ideas, but anchored in Christ's love.

I would love to have a hot cup of just about anything with you and listen to your theology, call me anytime at 239-250-6266. RON

A LETTER ABOUT THE PRUDENTIAL COMMITTEE

I would like to write a little bit about the church's Prudential Committee. It is the duty of this committee to maintain a general oversight of the programs and interests of the church, including charge of the properties, buildings, salaries, monitoring committees for budgeted and non-budgeted expenses, contracts, and business affairs of the church. As you can see, there is a lot of responsibility and commitment involved with this committee. That is why it is imperative to have a full committee meeting to make sure the operations of the church run smoothly.

The committee is made up of three Prudential members, the minister, and the chairpeople from 11 committees. While non-members may serve on any committee, only a church member can be the chair of that committee. A member is one who has participated in a ceremony requiring profession of faith, baptism or evidence of previous baptism, and acceptance of the Church Covenant. I went through this service 38 years ago when I became a member. It was an easy process and one that I have never regretted. Because of my choice to join, I have experienced unparalleled growth in my spiritual life, made friendships with people whom I now love and consider life-long friends. I have been able to help people in our community by working through the Outreach Committee and helping the church grow and run smoothly by participating in fund raisers. We are a family here, and I consider myself part of that family. This is my home. We have a membership Sunday coming up, and if you would like to join, see Pastor Ron.

Our by-laws state that each chairperson of a committee must attend Prudential meetings. This is an important way for all members of the church to have a say and a vote in the decisions made by this governing body. If a chairperson cannot attend a meeting, he or she needs to appoint someone else to attend in their place to represent that committee and vote on any business. These meetings are open to anyone in the church who wishes to attend. However, only church members are allowed to vote. We need a quorum for attendance in order for any voting to take place.

In conclusion, I would like to thank those of you who have ever volunteered to serve on a chair a committee. Your willingness to serve has contributed to the over-all good health of our church over the years and that feeling of family and fellowship when we work together to achieve a certain goal.
